- Be encouraged and supported for what you are doing "right" as a parent, and the strengths you bring
- Learn new parenting tips to improve your relationship with your children
- Go home with practical tools that can help you and your family



Back on Track

Description of Class:

Beech Acres Parenting Center recognizes that parents want to do what is best for their children. This program is a comprehensive and diverse six-week curriculum focusing on issues that fathers face in establishing/maintaining healthy relationships with their children, and providing for them financially, emotionally, and physically. The curriculum examines: barriers to providing financial support; what they learned from their own father; what they desire in a relationship with their children; what their relationship is to their children's mother; and varied techniques and tips to a better parenting relationship.

Participant Profile:

Participants are Clermont County Residents that are before the Court because they are not providing for their children financially (i.e., child support, medical insurance).

Objectives:

1. Fathers will identify their own parenting style as well as how they were parented.
2. Fathers will learn specific communication skills and problem solving techniques so that interactions among family members are more healthy, productive, and less stressful.
3. Fathers will identify and address the barriers in providing for their children financially, emotionally, and physically.

Date, Time and Location:

The Back on Track program will be offered 1 time per year. The class is six sessions and will run consecutively on Wednesdays from 6:00 pm – 7:30 pm. The class meets at Union Township Civic Center in Batavia (near Eastgate Mall). Parking is free. A welcome letter will be sent to each registrant, including directions. Dates include:

October 7, 14, 21, 28 and November 4, 11.
