Does Child Support End with a High School Diploma?

Batavia, Ohio. As high school seniors prepare for graduation each year, the Clermont County Child Support Enforcement (CSE) office receives a lot of calls asking whether child support and medical insurance orders end when a child turns 18 or graduates from high school. Ohio law states that the emancipation date of a child is when he or she reaches 18 and has graduated or is not attending an accredited high school on a full time basis (whichever date is latest), not to exceed the age of 19, unless your court order states otherwise.



Ohio law mandates that custodial parents notify CSE if there is any reason that child support should end; contact CSE as your child nears 18 to ensure proper continuation or termination of a child support order.
